# COVID-19 symptoms/ Contagious/ Infectious Illnesses/ Rashes/ Head Lice:

If your child has any COVID-19 symptoms or a contagious/infectious illness (including head lice), please notify the school immediately. Please ensure that children are not sent to school if they have any of the following symptoms: a temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or more, a new cough, loss or changed sense of taste or smell or shortness of breath. If a child has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, living with someone who is unwell and may have COVID-19 or if they have an existing breathing condition that has recently got worse, they should remain at home. It is advisable to contact your GP for advice.

In terms of headlice, it is wise to have a head lice shampoo or lotion, special fine combs etc. at home at all times, so that you are prepared if a request is made to treat your child's head. We advise that every parent/guardian fine combs their child's hair at least once a week. It is advisable for all children to be examined and treated, where necessary, immediately. The mid-term break is a good opportunity for you to examine your child's head for headlice and to treat them immediately if you notice them. Co-operation from everyone is appreciated to solve this problem in our schools.

## Hand Hygiene:

Children are reminded to wash their hands when leaving home in the morning and again upon arrival at home each evening. We will be washing hands regularly throughout the day and sanitising also. Thank you all for your cooperation and support. Please advise your child's teacher if your child is having any reaction to our sanitiser/soap. Well done to all the girls and boys on the great job that they are doing! Keep up the great work.

# Computer Safety:

A reminder to all parents to be extra vigilant regarding internet safety in the home. Please ensure that you are fully aware of your child's online activities and review history of searches regularly. Webwise is the Irish Internet Safety Awareness Centre. It provides information and advice on internet safety topics, including cyberbullying and privacy.

# REMINDER REGARDING PEANUTS IN SCHOOL:

The school is enforcing a strict ban on nut items in lunch boxes. PLEASE ENSURE THAT CHILDREN DO NOT BRING PEANUTS, NUTS OR PRODUCTS CONTAINING NUTS TO SCHOOL AS PART OF THEIR LUNCHES. Please note that nuts, (especially peanuts), hazelnuts, pine nuts, monkey nuts, barmbrack, chocolate spreads, peanut butter, almond butter, chocolate biscuits etc. are not permitted in school. We have a number of children who have severe allergies to nuts (especially peanuts) and we are anxious that they do not come in contact with them. Being in the vicinity of nuts can trigger a serious shock. Products will have to be removed, as exposure to products containing nuts will cause further serious reactions.

As Halloween approaches, please do not send barmbrack, monkey nuts or other seasonal items into school. Please be extra vigilant and feel free to contact the school if you have any queries regarding this matter. Snacksafely.com provides information regarding permissible lunch ideas.

Children are reminded to bring healthy lunches. Fruit and vegetables are major 'Food Dude' lunch box items, so we would encourage all pupils to continue to bring vegetables and fruit, together with usual healthy lunch items.

# **Communication with Parents:**

If a parent has a worry, no matter how small, please come to us and we will do our best to resolve any issues. Unfortunately, we will not be able to receive visitors into the school building, so please phone the school or email your child's class teacher. Communication should be with your child's class teacher. It is very important to keep in regular contact, even informally, with your child's teacher. If you wish to talk to the teacher formally or you have a specific issue that you wish to discuss with a class teacher an appointment must be made so that arrangements can be made for the class to be supervised and a call can be facilitated privately. We would emphasise that if a parent has a complaint, then this must be dealt with through the class teacher and not directly with other children or staff. This is for the safety and well-being of all. It is essential that this rule is adhered to. Please email your child's class teacher if you request a copy of our Grievance Procedures. Please forward a mobile number to your class teacher if you have not been receiving school text messages (1 number per family).
